Mental Health Grace Alliance is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization focused on seeing God's grace transform lives affected by mental health challenges (individuals, couples, and families).

"To love them well."

The Grace Alliance's mission is to equip the Body of Christ with evidence-based mental health resources and support to transform lives (science + Scripture). We are creating a new, simple mental health ministry (frontlines) response.

In 2011, Mental Health Grace Alliance ("The Grace Alliance") was founded to create practical and grace-filled resources for those living with mental health challenges (individuals + marriages/families). Grace Alliance curriculums utilize a whole-health (i.e., holistic) approach,

integrating evidence-based science (neuroscience, psychology, biomedical, etc.) and Biblical scriptures/faith experience for mental health recovery (resilience).

The remarkable impact of the Grace Alliance programs and training was <u>published in four journals</u>, with results showing:

- 1. Participants saw a reduction in mental health symptoms.
- 2. Participants were aided in overall mental health recovery.
- 3. Participants experienced a renewal of their faith.
- 4. Training increases confidence and skills to respond and minister to mental health challenges.

Today, we have grown to over 1100 Grace Alliance groups (Grace + Thrive Groups) and have seen thousands of individuals utilize our Grace Alliance resources in all 50 U.S. states and 25+ countries.



"King or cripple," He loves infinitely the same.

"I'd love to hold the hand of One who healed the blind and saw the leper run into the arms of love ... And king or cripple, they were the same to You ... You take a broken man and treat him like a king."

Mental Health Community Groups (discipleship-growth transforming lives)

Grace + Thrive Groups (individuals, couples, and families)

Community lay-led groups utilizing Grace Alliance's affordable curriculums blending science and faith (Scripture). The curriculum works on improving mental health wellness and well-being through a whole-person approach. Published results show that group participants had:

- 1. Reduction of difficult symptoms
- 2. Mental health recovery and trauma healing
- 3. Spiritual renewal

Grace + Thrive groups work alongside and aid professional intervention; they do not replace them.

Grace Academy + Network (Christian mental health equipping)

Our **FREE** online video training with ongoing equipping support removes cost barriers to start groups anywhere, anytime. With no leader training or subscription fees, we can provide group leaders worldwide with the following:

- 1. Free online training (videos)
- 2. Free, ongoing leader support videos, emails, and downloads
- 3. Free online events on relevant topics for the front-of-care

With no training and subscription fees, the average cost savings per leader is \$720 (annually).

We only count the groups that officially register with MHGA. Our data indicates that for every group registration, 2-3 other groups are starting (but not registering). Thus, we show this "unregistered" growth as a "+."

Blog article question about suicide and our response ("Is depression a sin? No!"):

"A friend and I are looking into whether or not people who commit suicide go to heaven, and had a question. The Bible mentions many times that the innocent go to heaven, like little children for example, so we were wondering if those with mental health disorders that cause suicidal thoughts and actions have reverted to a state of childlike innocence in where they cannot differentiate between right and wrong."

Our Grace Alliance response (suicide):

This is an excellent question in which you will find many various interpretations. In general, we at the Grace Alliance would subscribe to the thought that, in Christ (cross/resurrection), "suicide" is forgivable as any other sin. Christ's cross/resurrection covers the full spectrum of victory over sin and death (1 Cor. 15:57). OBVIOUSLY, suicide is not God's desire – as God desires to give us abundant life (John 10:10) and grace to overcome our pains (1 John 5:3–5). There is hope – even in our despair (1 Peter 1:3–9). In short, the reasoning or motive behind suicide is best explained by neuroscience and psychological factors – this would give us more compassion. There is an excellent exchange of leader support on the leader's Facebook page. Along with many experienced lay leaders, some of our leaders are made up of mental health pros and certified mental health specialists.



*9 monthly live + interactive online meetings (FREE).

Each month, Grace Alliance CEO, Joe Padilla, hosts a live, interactive meeting with group leaders across the globe. The agenda is simple: ask any question, and other leaders and our Grace Alliance team responds with their incredible experience and knowledge.

2 New Educational Guides and 3 New Devotionals (FREE).

Joe Padilla (MHGA CEO) authored these five new resources for a two-fold purpose. First, to provide new supportive resources for group leaders and group participants. Second, to provide anyone worldwide with helpful answers and resources for the mental health and in Christ journey.

This new resource page (with free resources) was the fifth most popular page on our website in 2023.

Baylor University Internship Program (Religion Dept.)

As part of the Religion department's "Intro to ministry" class, Joe Padilla facilitates Baylor students interested in mental health ministry each semester. Alongside various organizational tasks, Joe trains and provides the students with hands-on group experience.

The oversight professor has been impressed with the program and the students have also commented how the program both stretched them, but seeing the Biblical integration with the science was helpful.

Collaborating with results (Hong Kong)

In 2021, we partnered with the <u>Baptist OI Kwan Social Services (BOKSS</u>) in Hong Kong to translate and implement our <u>Living Grace Groups</u>. They implemented and evaluated 10 Living Grace Groups (in-person and online) showing above average results (right).

What's next: Family Grace and possible research.

With the transformational stories they shared with us and these unique outcomes, they're looking into potential studies with one of the universities in Hong Kong. They translated and launched Family Grace Groups in June 2023.

Hong Kong Grace Group Results

+ 100% of the participants agreed that the group helped them become aware of their physical, emotional, and spiritual condition.

+ 94% of the participants agreed that the group helped improve their overall physical, emotional, and spiritual well-being.

+ 83% of the participants agreed they learned useful tools in the group.

+ 77% of the participants believed they could live a fulfilling life after joining the group.

Collaborating for trauma healing (Ukraine refugees)

Life Chaplains Voice of Persecuted Christians Poland Mental Health Grace Alliance

In 2023, we partnered with **Life Chaplains** (with **Voice of Persecuted Christians Poland**) to translate and pilot six chapters of our Living Hope* (trauma healing group resources) for Ukrainian clergy refugees. The pilot project went well, with good feedback from the participants. **Living Hope has published results for trauma healing and recovery.*

Family Grace: 16-week topical curriculum for families/marriages supporting a loved one's mental health wellness.

*Living Grace: 16-week topical curriculum for individuals' mental health wellness.

Redefine Grace: 10-week topical curriculum for students' mental health wellness.

***Thrive (course):** 20 topics - in-depth, whole-health course/curriculum for mental health wellness (resilience, mental health recovery).

*Evidence-based in group use and coaching (Thrive), published in psychological journals showing mental health symptom reduction, renewed faith, and overall mental health recovery.

Donor-supported to provide affordable workbooks.

We set the price of the workbooks to cover their production (printing costs), shipping, and handling fees (all U.S. orders include free shipping and 50% of int'l shipping costs). All proceeds from the workbooks go back into Mental

Health Grace Alliance.

+ Professional Accountability. In 2023, our team focused on building a strong foundation for the organization after over a decade of operations and growth. This included new accountability systems with a CPA team, a higher-performing donor management system, and more (Operations).

+ Accessible and Reachable: Removing Cost Barriers. We also expanded our Outreach and Group Leader Training and Support by transferring all e-books to Amazon and offering free U.S. shipping (50% off international shipping) on ALL orders (no matter the size!). An increase in international interest in our resources led us to opportunities for translations of our resources and international reach into Hong Kong and with Ukrainian refugees.

+ Equipping, Connecting, and Collaborating to impact thousands. Other focus areas for the organization included group leader network support (for the movement), partnerships with Baylor University and other organizations, and outreach (emails to subscribers, connection meetings with church leaders, speaking events, etc.).
